\*\*First time out-of-state graduate students are allotted an additional \$126 in Book and Supplies expenses (\$1,246 total) and \$1,432 for Computer expenses for the academic year. Total COA for first time out-of-state graduate students is **\$66,042**.

## The above 2024-25 Cost-of-Attendance (COA) budget represents an ESTIMATE of the total cost to attend Virginia Tech for one academic year.

There may be differences between your actual charges and these estimates based on fees specific to certain colleges or majors.

Books, Transportation, and Personal expenses are variable, out-of-pocket costs that will not be included on your billing statement. These charges will vary by student. Loan fees are the average amount of loan fees incurred by all students for Federal Direct Loan funds during the 2023-24 academic year and only applied to students that use a Federal Direct Loan.

Most graduate students that complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) are eligible for an Unsubsidized Direct Loan of \$20,500 per year. Additional funding, up to the full Cost of Attendance, minus other financial aid, can be obtained through the Graduate PLUS Loan. Graduate Assistantships are considered other sources of financial aid and can reduce initial loan amounts. If not attending full time, this budget will be prorated by the number of credits enrolled.
