- ✓ Submit this signed Appeal Form to our office by fax, document uploader, or in person
- ✓ Attach a NEW signed personal statement attesting to your current relationship with both biological/adoptive parents, where you live during school breaks, how you are financially supported, and the circumstances on which you are seeking independent status.

Please keep in mind that a parent’s unwillingness or inability to contribute financially is not a valid reason for appeal.

Please complete the FAFSA and submit this re-evaluation with the required attachments by **April 1, 2022**. Failure to meet this deadline may result in a reduction in financial aid.
