SOURCES of Aid

Federal Aid

The federal government is the largest financial aid provider in the nation. Types of financial aid for college that the federal government offers include loans, grants, and work-study funds.

State Aid

State governments offer grants, scholarships, state loans, and tuition assistance.

Institutional Aid

Institutional financial aid consists of aid that individual colleges and universities provide to their students. Colleges and universities typically offer scholarships, grants, and employment programs.

Private Aid

Typically in the form of loans and scholarships, private financial aid comes from corporations, religious organizations, cultural organizations, professional and service organizations, and more.

Undergraduate and Graduate Financial Aid Programs

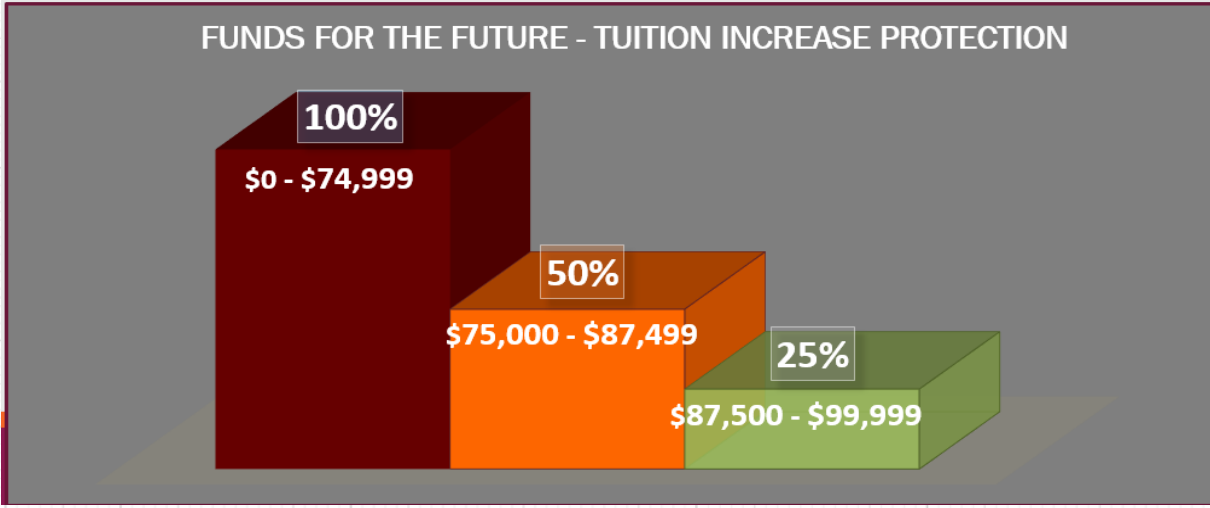

FAFSA –Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) sent to colleges listed on FAFSA a few days after FAFSA is submitted
- College reviews ISIR and creates an award package so students can make a decision on what school to attend by May 1st

Pay attention to:

- **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)**

This is NOT the amount you pay.

- **Verification**

If there's an asterisk next to your EFC, it means the school will request documentation to verify the accuracy of your FAFSA – it does NOT mean you did anything wrong!

 - Send written explanation and documentation to financial aid office at each college (appeal process is explained on school websites)
 - College will review and request additional information if necessary
 - CAN result in additional need based aid

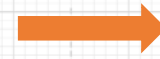
