

TYPES OF AID – Need based/Merit Based

- •Grants/Scholarships- "Free Money"
- Federal Work-Study
- •Loans

Need based aid is awarded according to financial information from FAFSA



SOURCES of Aid

Federal Aid

The federal government is the largest financial aid provider in the nation. Types of financial aid for college that the federal government offers include loans, grants, and work-study funds.

State Aid

State governments offer grants, scholarships, state loans, and tuition assistance.

Institutional Aid

Institutional financial aid consists of aid that individual colleges and universities provide to their students. Colleges and universities typically offer scholarships, grants, and employment programs.

Private Aid

Typically in the form of loans and scholarships, private financial aid comes from corporations, religious organizations, cultural organizations, professional and service organizations, and more.



 College reviews ISIR and creates an award package so students can make a decision on what school to attend by May 1st

- CAN result in additional need based aid




